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The Sett And Weaving Of

The sett is the density of the warp. It is the number of ends (warp threads) per inch (epi). The sett you choose depends on the yarns, the weave structure (e.g., plain or twill, etc.) and the intended purpose of the finished piece (e.g., a loosely-woven shawl or upholstery in a tight, firm weave, or anywhere in between). It is obvious that a thin thread like sewing thread would have more ...

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So sett is important, regardless of loom, and if you are trying to make a nice length of fabric, its what makes the difference between something that is near enough, and something that is good! Its worth getting hold of a weaving book and reading up about.

In last week's post I talked about the important relationship between warp and weft sizes when weaving tapestry. These questions are intimately connected to sett. Sett is most easily understood as the number of warp

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threads in a unit of measure. In the USA we use inches, in Europe you probably use centimeters.

Sett: What does it have to do with tapestry weaving ...

The warp size, warp sett, and weft size do not work well together in this example. Fabric quality. Tapestry weaving creates a fabric and the quality of that fabric is important.

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for your project can be a bit of a challenge. If the same yarn is used in both warp and weft, the following formula should result in a balanced weave structure. W = Wrap the yarn around a ruler, ...

The first number is its "open" or wide sett, appropriate for lace weaves. The middle is the balanced plain weave (BPW) sett, often referred to as its plain weave or tabby sett. The third number is its "close" sett, often called a twill sett. These expressions assume that you are warping and weaving with the same yarn.

Sett Solutions and Binding a Denim Rag Rug After correcting the two threading errors on my second warp on the Weaver's Delight, I planned on weaving a denim rug next. The loom was warped at 12 epi and set up to weave plain weave. That was no problem at all with the rug at the left.

BUT, many folks are weaving 4-color Echo and using a looser sett, even a plain weave sett, because they want to maximize the color effects, creating

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iridescence by using the same grist yarns in both warp and weft.

Starting with the red shuttle, it would travel from left to right and back again weaving two red threads into the sett. To produce our thread count of 4 red it would do that twice. Then the blue shuttle would fly out and back 14 times ($14 \times 2 = 28$ blue threads), then the green shuttle would make 14 journeys and then back to the red which, this time would make 28 journeys ($28 \times 2 = 56$ red).

What is Sett? - Mirrix Looms

In weaving, the sett is how close together (or how far apart) the warp ends are. The sett is often expressed as

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a number, followed by the term "EPI," which stands for "ends per inch."

Deciding on a sett is a skill that takes practice and plenty of sampling, but I like to use our Spinner's Multitool to get a ballpark idea of which sett to choose.

Calculating Sett for Weaving Using the ... - Fiber Sprite

You need to use the twill sett because waffle weave has such long floats. If your sett is more open then your weft will pack down and you won't have a balanced weave...you will have weft-faced waffle which won't be waffle anymore. Waffle weave needs to be balanced to make the little indents. Use the 24 epi as suggested.
